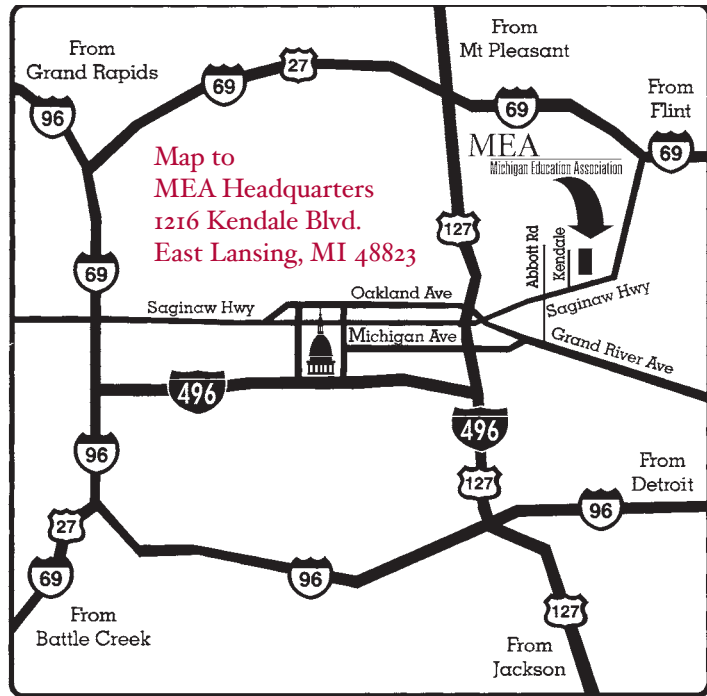

46th Annual MEA/MAEA Exhibit

Purpose of the Exhibit

The Michigan Education Association (MEA) and the Michigan Art Education Association (MAEA) announce their annual purchase exhibit to acquire artwork to enhance the MEA headquarters in East Lansing and MEA regional and UniServ offices throughout the state. This exhibit provides an opportunity to showcase the artwork of our members.

Eligibility

Any member of MEA, MAEA or MEA-Retired is eligible to submit artwork. Proof of membership must be presented upon entry. No entry fee required.

Paintings, drawings, prints, ceramics, jewelry, metal work, enamels, mosaics, wood, fibers, stained glass, photographs, experimental media and sculptures are all eligible. All artwork submitted must be original work. Artwork deemed not original by the juror will not be accepted. Each artist may submit up to two works. Works not for sale will not be accepted.

Requirements for Hanging—IMPORTANT

All work meant to be hung MUST be framed and rigged with picture hanging wire or it will be rejected. The wire must be firmly attached to the frame. Artwork over 25 lbs. can not be hung. (HANGING CLIPS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.) Provide any preferred display accessories.

Entry Forms/ Catalog Card

Entry forms and catalog card must accompany artwork. Attach one entry form to the back of each piece and submit catalog card with artwork. It is important to include your e-mail address on the entry information for future art show announcements, programs and notification of whether work is accepted.

The price of the artwork must be indicated on the entry form. **Please consider the budget limitations of the committee when pricing your artwork.** Pieces priced under \$800 are more likely to be purchased. Works that are purchased will become part of MEA's permanent collection. Works sold are not subject to a commission.

Delivery of Work

Between **March 1-12**, hand carry work to MEA headquarters, 1216 Kendale Blvd., East Lansing. Works will be accepted from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays and from 9 a.m. -noon on **Saturday, March 13.**

2010 Juror

Diane Scully is currently the secondary division director of the National Art Education Association. She has served as NAEA's Western Region vice president, on its Finance Committee, as convention presenter, and a state representative delegate.

Ms. Scully is a visual arts teacher in the Columbia Heights Schools in Minnesota and an adjunct professor at the college of St. Scholastica. At Columbia Heights, she developed and implemented the elementary arts program, served as department chair and on the Central Middle School Building Leadership Committee. She has been teaching since 1979.

Diane's education includes bachelor's of both arts and sciences from Bemidji State University, master's of fine arts from the University of Oregon and additional graduate course work at Hamline University, Carlton College and the University of Minnesota.

She has received the following honors: 1990 AEM Elementary Art Educator of the Year; 2000 Art Educators of Minnesota Distinguished Service Award; 2001 NAEA Distinguished Service Award; and 1991 NAEA Western Region Elementary Art Educator of the Year. Her artwork is on display in private and public collections and she received two purchase awards from the General Mills Company in Minneapolis.

She has been a member of the Art Educators of Minnesota since 1979 and served as vice president and president. She has also served as president, negotiator and grievance chair for her local union. She has been the coordinator, writer and/or pilot of many of Minnesota's state standards dealing with art education.

Awards/ Recognition

The juror determines whether each artwork entry is accepted or rejected into the exhibit. Acceptance into the show does not guarantee purchase. The committee then notifies the artist by e-mail. Awards are as follows: 1) Juror's award; 2) MEA purchase awards; 3) MAEA purchase award; 4) Best of Show; 5) Honorable Mention.

Exhibit

The exhibit opens at MEA headquarters in East Lansing on March 15 and continues through April 23, 2010. Work accepted for the annual exhibit **may not be withdrawn before the close of the exhibit on April 23.** The public is invited and encouraged to attend.
